Role Title: Young Community Ambassador for Stratford East aged 18-25 years

Stratford East has always played a pivotal role in the life of East London, and we have a proud history of connecting with our local community. In December 2024 we celebrate our 140th anniversary and this milestone is the time to preserve and promote our heritage as well as welcoming new audiences into the building.

Main purpose and scope of the role

This role is a unique and exciting opportunity to work closely with one of London's best theatres and become part of a supportive and creative team. Community Ambassadors will be trained volunteers who will help build and strengthen our connections in the community, drawing on their own links to expand our reach.

They will also help us to unlock and record our community's theatre-going experiences and stories and use our heritage to increase awareness of the history of the theatre through hosting events, backstage tours, workshops and giving out free tickets. At the heart of the project is the simple idea of connection - between people, community organisations, and theatres, plus an opportunity to experience the theatre from behind the scenes and be part of something really special.

No prior Stratford East experience or knowledge of the theatre is necessary – we are simply looking for engaged, passionate individuals.

- Co-host groups coming to see shows or join workshops at Stratford East
- Lead heritage-focused backstage tours at Stratford East
